


Reading Choice Board

Use time order words (First, Next, Then, Last, Finally).</p>	<p>Choose a fictional book that you have read. Write a summary telling what the new book will be about it.</p>	<p>Think of some characters from books you have already read. What character do you have the most in common with? Why?
